SUPPLY LIST

- Notebook paper (college-ruled)
- #2 Pencils (any type - standard or mechanical, if using standard pencils, Ticonderoga is the preferred brand)
- Extra pencil lead (only if using mechanical pencils)
- Red and blue ballpoint ink pens
- 10-count markers (fine point or broadline)
- 12 count-colored pencils (standard colors)
- Cap or block erasers
- Handheld pencil sharpener with shavings receptacle (if using standard pencils)
